Abraham Lincoln was born (1809)	Abraham Lincoln delivered the Gettysburg Address (1863)
The Washington Monument was completed (1884)	Franklin D. Roosevelt and Eleanor Roosevelt were married (1905)
The Lincoln Memorial was completed and dedicated (1922)	John F. Kennedy gave his famous inaugural address (1961)
George Washington was appointed commander-in-chief of the Continental Army (1775)	Washington's army went into winter quarters at Valley Forge (1777)
John F. Kennedy announced the goal of landing a man on the moon (1961)	Thomas Jefferson finalized the Louisiana Purchase, doubling the size of the United States (1803)
